100 Years of Healing at Kendu Adventist Hospital, Kenya

Dr. Denny Hong SM'15, who was the featured speaker at our 2023 Fall Mission Luncheon, sent this update about the Centennial Celebration of the SDA medical mission work in Kenya. The Auxiliary gave Kendu Adventist Hospital \$20,000 in funds for their ICU conversion that year.

The June 2025 event at Kendu Adventist Hospital was celebrated by over 1000 people, including government and national leaders, LLU SIMS, SDA church representatives, ADRA Finland, and previous hospital workers. The Carscallen family (grandson of the first SDA missionary to Kenya) also attended.

After the first SDA church in Kenya was built in 1906, a grass-thatched hospital with six beds was started in 1925 at Kendu Bay. This has now become Kendu Adventist Hospital with 170 beds. The complex includes a School of Medical Sciences, an elementary school and a Comprehensive Care Center.

Mission Update from Moundou, Chad

Dr. James Appel SM'00 wrote to us after a visit to Moundou Adventist Surgery Center, Chad, in January 2025. (Letter summarized)

The Moundou Adventist Surgery Center opened in 2010 thanks to a \$70,000 gift from the Medical Auxiliary. Dr. Appel and his wife Sarah worked in Moundou from 2012-2014, beginning with mainly surgical and obstetrics cases. The SIGN orthopedic nail program allowed them to treat long bone fractures and brought in new cases. From 2014-2016 Scott SM'85 and Becky Gardner took over. As a general surgeon, Scott increased the Center's reputation for quality surgery and orthopedics until it became the referral center for Southern Chad.

In 2016 the first Chadian Adventist physician, Odei Abdou, moved to Moundou. Dr. Odei, a generalist, began learning and doing surgery with Appolinaire, a nurse's aide who had been the surgical scrub assistant to both Drs. Appel and Gardner. In 2020 Dr. Odei left to do an orthopedic residency but a string of Chadian general practitioners has since rotated through Moundou, doing surgery and orthopedics with Appolinaire. Doctors Without Borders and other international agencies working

with Central African Republic refugees have partnered with the Center to care for trauma victims. The majority of the practice is orthopedics.

Recently, a 1.5 acre property across the street from the Center became available and was fenced with a wall funded by Adventist Health International. After his January visit, Dr. Appel began working with the current Center administrator and a US architect to develop a site plan for the new compound. There are critical needs for a new Emergency Department and Operating Theater, as during his visit Dr. Appel saw the Post-Anesthesia Care Unit being used as an ER and the single operating room overloaded with 6-10 major orthopedic surgery cases a day.

What the Auxiliary started in 2010 has provided life-saving and life-changing surgeries for thousands of patients.

Jasmine Cha SM'28


