## What Giving Gets Us — Fall Luncheon

"What Giving Gets Us" was the title of Dr. Gillian Seton's presentation at the Fall Luncheon held on October 14 at the Mitten Building in Redlands. Dr. Seton, SM'08, had just begun her deferred mission service as a surgeon at SDA Cooper Hospital in Monrovia, Liberia when the Ebola epidemic broke out in 2014. Gillian was the only US physician on site until Dr. James Appel, SM'00 (see AN Fall 2025 issue), arrived to help. One of the greatest blessings she found in her service there was the phenomenal friendship of her hospital team and the local people. She also became attached to a preemie infant named Devine whom she had to resuscitate multiple times after his birth. Devine is now a healthy, happy 11-year-old residing with his adoptive mom Gillian here in the USA.

Dr. Seton mentioned how many times she appreciated gifts sent by our Auxiliary, including \$10,000 for surgical supplies and personal protective equipment during the Ebola epidemic. Another \$10,000 was sent in 2015-16 to upgrade the operating theatre/surgical instruments. A portable x-ray machine gifted in 2017 and an ultrasound machine sent in 2018-19 were invaluable in making diagnoses. When Dr. Seton and her son transferred to Malamulo Hospital, Malawi, at the start of the COVID pandemic in 2020, she was immensely grateful to find a stove and refrigerator donated by the Auxiliary. Malamulo Hospital has received many other Auxiliary gifts over the years and the Auxiliary was instrumental in establishing a school for missionary children there.




